FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Welcome to the second edition of our school bulletin for 2019.

There are only a few more days left of this term and everyone is starting to think about their holiday plans. The term has certainly raced away and it is almost surreal to think that our Year 12 students only have 2 more terms with us.

I would like to welcome Chris Vaughen to our school. Chris is going to be taking over from Rey Hassan, our IT Technician, who will be leaving us at the end of this term. On behalf of our school and community, I would like to thank Rey for all his efforts over the past year and wish him all the best in his new position.

On Thursday the 4th of April, I had the pleasure of attending the Kwinana Industries Council (KIC) Iwomen graduation. WCHS is one of 14 schools from the public and private sector, that are part of KIC. Two of our year 10 young ladies, Taylor Lloyd and Kiriana Ngawaka, were selected to attend the 6 week course. I was very proud of them, they both spoke eloquently and represented our school with incredible style. We are very fortunate to be part of this partnership. Later in the year we will have two male students selected for IMen and five Year 9 students selected for Bright SparX.

We are now starting a wonderful partnership with our local neighbours, Living Waters Lutheran College. We are joining forces to start a local surfing competition. I believe it is the first along the strip and after we have completed our pilot program, I can see it expanding further to where we invite other schools to participate. Watch out Margaret River Classic! I would like to acknowledge and applaud Shane Stevens, one of our Health and Physical Education teachers, for this innovative partnership. The first competition is already planned for early next term which is very exciting.

Term one is always busy with regards to our primary school transition program. In the last few weeks of term we have had four of our five network primary schools visit WCHS: Port Kennedy PS, Warnbro PS, Rockingham Lakes PS and Endeavour PS. The focus this term has been on meeting staff, getting to know the layout of the school, understanding our consistent practices and our 3 B's: Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be your Best. Students also had learning experiences in our two Specialist Programs: Creative Arts and Adventure Recreation. Our student leaders take on an important role on these days and they were as always amazing, self-directed and so efficient; confidently moving 80 year 6 students from one session to another.

ANZAC day this year occurs during the school holidays so we are coming together as a school community on Friday 12th of April to hold our ANZAC Day Assembly. This year the focus is on military nurses. Military nurses first sailed to the Boer War in South Africa in January 1900 and since then have served in theatres of war and conflict around the world. Our students will be taking a much bigger role in our assembly this year and I look forward to seeing the result of all their research and preparation.

Next term the temperature tends to drop and the wind picks up. Please ensure your child has the school jacket and the rest of our school uniform in order to keep warm. The uniform shop operating hours are advertised in this bulletin and on our website.

their school community. It provides an opportunity to focus on bullying and the changes we can all make to help create safer communities for everyone.


Thank you for joining with over 2.4 million students around Australia who are driving action in their school communities.

It was also pretty interesting to learn how A.I learns different patterns, for example the game Quickdraw, it asks you to draw something and identifies it by using its knowledge from previously drawn things. They also explained how


people use drones to save people's lives by flying over a rip in the ocean and dropping a Personal Flotation Device (PFD) on them."





Commedia Dell' Arte Workshop

Year 9 and 10 CASP Performance students and Year 11 General Drama students participated in a Commedia Dell' Arte Workshop with Shane McMullan from Into The Mask Theatre. Commedia Dell' Arte is a highly physical theatre style using easily recognisable stock characters. Students explored the physicality of Zanni, Capitano, Innamortati, Dottore and Pantalone in the 'canavaccio' or scenes typical to Commedia. Students explored the master and servant dynamic between the characters and how this can be entertaining for audiences. 9 and 10 CASP students will be using the

skills developed from this workshop to create a performance for assessment which will equip students with a physical skill set when working towards their Semester 1 showcase. Yr 11 General Drama students explored the master servant relationship to highlight the differences between characters in their performance of The Stones. Shane explained the links between the physical traits of characters and the Laban movement Efforts. Students were able to create two very different characters using the physicality of Zanni and Capitano.
