

HOW TO APPLY

STEP 1 - TERM 1

All specialist programs have an application process that begins with an application form. These forms will be given to students through our feeder primary schools by the end of Term 1 or emailed on request.

STEP 2 - TERM 2

Students who submit an application form by the due date will be invited to participate in a selection process. The process differs depending on the specialist program that is being applied for. For example, Adventure Recreation applicants are often invited to a practical interview while CASP applicants may require a portfolio.

STEP 3 - TERM 3

Successful applicants are notified and requested to confirm their acceptance. This usually occurs by the end of Term 3.

N.B. Enrolment paperwork must be completed to secure a place.

CREATIVE ARTS SPECIALIST PROGRAM (CASP)

CREATE, MAKE, LEARN, SHARE

The Creative Arts Specialist Program (CASP) is designed to enable students to create, make, learn and share a wide range of arts experiences. CASP staff and students work alongside each other to create a school based creative arts environment that develops on understanding and respect for a range of cultural practices. CASP develops creative problem solving skills that celebrates diversity and the individual.

CASP students will actively participate in the specialist program through two streams:

- Studio: Visual Arts and Media Arts
- Performance: Dance and Drama

Students will create works at a professional standard for public and community events. CASP students will benefit from professional and public arts industry experience through an understanding of:

- Arts roles and responsibilities
- Developing an artistic portfolio of artworks/ events
- Engaging in Arts and Cultural dialogue.



ADVENTURE RECREATION PROGRAM (AD REC)

CHALLENGE, EXPERIENCE, GROW, LEAD

The Adventure Recreation program takes advantage of the unique environments that surround Warnbro CHS such as the Shoalwater Marine Park and the Darling Range. Expeditions also take place across WA including the Margaret River Region and Albany Region.

Students participate in activities such as abseiling, snorkelling, rock climbing, sea kayaking, surfing, and mountain biking. They are taught environmental principles such as 'leave no trace' ethics, risk management and ecological sustainability.

The program aims to enhance the personal development, leadership and self-esteem of our students while fostering environmental awareness.

The Adventure Recreation program develops leadership skills in students by guiding them through a four year experiential program where students are challenged in daily activities and multi-day expeditions.

The Adventure Recreation program is one of only two such programs offered in the state.
